Purpose of the post

The incumbent will support WASH activities in the camps in and out of the POC areas, participate in assessments, planning and evaluation with RRM teams. Where required the Emergency WASH Officer will conduct, training, monitoring and reporting, and assist implementing partners in providing effective and coherent WASH response to the IDPs in the following manner:

Major Duties and Responsibilities

- Collects and analyzes water hygiene and sanitation related data coming from the IRNA assessment reports and recommend appropriate action.
- Undertakes ongoing visits to UNICEF supported and partners project sites, assesses local conditions and resources required, and monitors WASH activities in the camps and come up with reports, proposals and technical recommendations for partners' action.
- Undertakes follow-up action on emergency WASH response activities contributes remedial actions and prepares relevant reports.
- Conduct minor trainings to water point mechanics in minor repairs of non-functioning boreholes in the IDP locations
- Establishes co-operation with WASH Partners on ground so that UNICEF support is effectively utilised and responses to affected population are met in a timely manner
- Monitors the utilisation of UNICEF core pipeline supplies at the sites and report as necessary.
- Participates in WASH coordination meetings with key international and national actors involved on local levels, provide advice, develop and share a proposed strategy in WASH & inter-sectoral group meetings to effectively implement WASH response .
- Submits weekly and monthly reports and regularly informs the WASH section on relevant and urgent issues.
- **Expected Deliverables**
- Mission reports on RRM activities and highlighting gaps in visited locations.
- Monthly situation updates on WASH Response during RRM missions including the level of stock in the field, outcome indicators in the different location and POC areas
- Updated NGOs intervention and WSH capacity mapping in the IDP camps camps.
- Highlighting any issues for further follow-up and action.

Minimum qualifications & experience required.

- University degree on water and sanitation or related technical fields. Public Health, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Geology, Hydrology, Sanitation Engineering etc.
- At least 2 years' experience in emergency water supply, sanitation and hygiene in developing countries, with proven field experience in sanitation and hygiene in emergencies. Knowledge of the latest developments in emergency sanitation and hygiene, including demonstrated experience of integrating gender & diversity issues in to public health.
 - Fluency in English. Fluency in one or more local languages will be an advantage.

Remuneration: An attractive package will be applicable at the UN salary scale including social security benefits.
